**"Dance Untitled" Imagine Ballet Theatre Performance** - "What Do Cartoons, Ballet, Chairs and Modern Dance All Have In Common?"

Come Find Out At "Dance Untitled" as Imagine Ballet Theatre Opens Its Fall Season

Ever wanted to attend a ballet, but wondered what it would be like?

Well, now is the time! Imagine Ballet Theatre (IBT) will open its 3rd successful season with a program that will delight audience members of all ages - from 5 years of age to 105! The program "Dance Untitled" will bring together world premieres, a cartoon favorite, classical ballet, the return of IBT audience favorites, modern dance and a guest artist from Ballet West.

Imagine Ballet will bring back an audience favorite The Three Graces, which premiered in 2004. Company members will share the stage with Ballet West Guest Artist, Christopher Sellars. One of the missions of IBT is to give the company members the opportunity to work with professional dancers. Mr. Sellars began his dance training at the age of 11, at the Orange County Dance Center, a public studio in Huntington Beach, California. His ballet teachers were his parents, who also were professional ballet dancers. After eight years of training in California, he left to study at the prestigious Rock School for Dance Education in PA. After a year of working with the renowned faculty, and teachers, such as: Christopher Fleming, he was offered a position in Ballet West's second company. He has recently been promoted to a company artist and is dancing full time for Ballet West. Mr. Sellars will dance the part of Pan. Mr. Sellars will appear by kind permission of Ballet West.

IBT will add three World Premieres to its repertoire - two ballets and one modern piece. The pieces will showcase the companies versatile training. Classic Tunes and Jubilarium, were choreographed by IBT's Artistic Director, Raymond Van Mason. In Classic Tunes, IBT dancers will appear with well-known beloved cartoon characters, who will dance to the music of Carl W. Stalling, after Johann Strauss and Peter Tchaikovsky. Individuals will need to attend a performance to see who the "famous guest cartoon artists" will be. Jubilarium, is a strong ballet that showcases the dancers classical technique. The ballet will be danced by Allysa Alger, Tessa Whiting, Sarah Guyon and Chelsea Keefer. Le Chaise Bleu, a modern piece, was choreographed by former RDT dancer, Angela Banchero-Kelleher. It is a lively piece set to blues music. The piece was partially funded by Weber County RAMP tax (Recreation, Arts, Museums and Parks) and the Egyptian Theater Foundation. This is the second piece Banchero-Kelleher has choreographed for the company.

The company will also bring back the dazzling ballet Twisted Infatuation, after returning from an invitation to dance the piece November 11, at the "Dance Under The Stars Choreography Festival" at the McCallum Theatre in Palm Desert, CA. The piece will be danced by company members Joshua Millsap, Darren Smith, Sarah Guyon, and Chelsea Keefer. The ballet showcases the strong technique and talents of the dancers and will stun the audience with its alluring lifts and spins. The company will round out the evening performance with the ballet Masquerade, with its elaborate costumes, involving the entire company. IBT is a ballet company that Ogden should be proud of to call its own.
